BYLAW 9-16

A BYLAW TO REGULATE OPEN AIR FIRES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF VAL MARIE

The Council of the Village of Val Marie in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

Purpose

1. The purpose of this bylaw is to control and regulate the use of fire pits and open air fires within the Village of Val Marie.

Definitions

- 2. In this bylaw:
 - a. "Administrator" shall mean the administrator of the municipality;
 - b. "Council" shall mean the council of the municipality;
 - c. "Fire Pit" shall mean a permanently affixed or portable outdoor fire receptacle;
 - d. "Outdoor Fireplace" shall mean an enclosed and permanent affixed outdoor fire receptacle which incorporates a permanently affixed chimney or flue and is constructed of brick, rock or other masonry;

Open Air Fires

- 3. No person shall start or permit an open air fire to be started or continued within the Village limits unless the following requirements have been met:
 - a. The fire is contained in a non-combustible receptacle, a fire pit or outdoor fireplace, constructed of concrete, clay, brick, or sheet metal with a minimum 18 gauge thickness;
 - b. The receptacle is covered with a heavy gauge metal screen with openings not exceeding 13 millimeters (1/2 inch);
 - c. The size of the fire box of the receptacle does not exceed75cm (30 inches) in any dimension;
 - d. A water source sufficient enough to extinguish the fire is ready and easily accessible.
 - e. The fire is constantly supervised by an adult.

Fire Pits and Outdoor Fireplaces

4. Fire Pits and Outdoor Fireplaces shall meet the following requirements:

- a. The fuel used in a Fire Pit or Outdoor Fireplace shall be only charcoal, clean wood, or manufactured fire logs.
- b. They shall be a minimum distance of 3 meters (10 feet) from any building, porch, deck or similar amenity space and property line.
- c. They shall not be used on combustible decks or balconies.
- d. Shall be situated on a non-combustible surface.
- 5. No person shall cause, allow or permit the burning of the following materials in a Fire Pit or Outdoor Fireplace: waste, paper, cardboard, treated or painted lumber, animal carcasses, tailings, or garbage.
- 6. Fire Pits or Outdoor Fireplaces shall be clear of overhangs such as tree branches, utility Lines and structures.
- 7. Fire Pits or Outdoor Fireplaces shall not be used in windy conditions conducive to creating a fire spread.
- 8. Where requested by the Fire Chief, a Fire inspector or a peace officer, a person shall extinguish a fire in a Fire Pit or Outdoor Fireplace.

Repealing Clause

9. Bylaw 16-67, 2-89, 1-02, 7-03 are hereby repealed.
